From Police Chief Brian Dressler



Warm weather and free time are two things that we all enjoy. We can all probably agree that there isn't enough of both. Unfortunately for some people these two things also bring opportunity for crime.

I'm asked often about neighborhood watch programs and whether or not those are effective programs to keep neighborhoods safe. While any extra measures citizens take to keep a watchful eye on their neighborhood are a good thing, I believe there are equally effective ways that take less coordination. I have found that if residents will do two simple things and refrain from doing one thing that they can greatly decrease their chances of being victimized.

First of all I would encourage you to take advantage of our vacation/

away from home checks. Simply letting the police department know when you are going to be away will guarantee your home will be added to our checklist and will be checked several times daily by our patrolmen. This form can be downloaded online or filled out at the police department. Additionally, tell a trusted neighbor that you are leaving and to report any unusual activity to the police department.

The second thing is good lighting. Bad guys don't like to go where the police may be and they don't like to be in well lit areas when committing crime. Well lit areas around your house will not only deter criminal activity but allow your neighbors to be able to clearly see any suspicious activity around your home. As important as it is to tell us that you are leaving it's equally important for that information not to enter into

the wrong hands. Often when we investigate burglaries we find that members of the family have posted their vacation plans on a social networking site and some will even use a program that pin-points where they are during the day. This is a gift to the bad guys!

I'd like to assure you that as a whole our community is a safe place to live and if we continue to work together we can keep it that way long into the future. If you and other residents feel the need to implement additional methods of neighborhood security, we will of course be happy to offer any guidance you may need.

Thank you again for your continued partnership with your police department. We remain ready to assist you if you find yourself in need of our services.

2012 Sidewalk Project To Begin Soon

As we enter year three of the Village's ten year sidewalk plan, here is a list of the areas which we will be completing this year:

- **Koehler Street:** On the south side of the street beginning at Gates Street a new sidewalk will be constructed. It will end at the Memorial Park upper driveway. **There is a newer section at Gates Street which will stay. The new sidewalk will connect with this section.*
- **Valley View Road:** On the north side of the street between the lower two high school driveways, we will be constructing a new sidewalk. Also at this location, a cross walk will be created on the roadway to the sidewalk on the other side of the street.
- **Church Street:** We will remove and replace the section of sidewalk between Black Drive and High Street.
- **Church Street:** There will be miscellaneous spot repairs made, as well as new sidewalk constructed where it currently ends on the north side of the street to Fairview Avenue.

We realize that there will be some inconvenience to the residents who either live or walk in these areas. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation during the construction and or repair of these new sidewalks. The community as a whole will benefit greatly from this project.

Summer Brush Pick Ups

Held on the 2nd Monday of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are July 9th, August 13th, September 10th and October 8th.

Please note that pick ups will begin on the specified dates, weather permitting. Depending on the amount of brush that needs to be picked up, it may take several days to complete. Brush must be at the curb by 8 am on the scheduled pick up date. Once pick up has taken place in your neighborhood, the crew will not return until the following month. Each pick up is limited to a maximum of 15 minutes. If more time is needed, it will be left until the following month.

Shrubs will only be taken if the root ball has been removed. Please keep sidewalks clear of brush as stated in the village’s codified ordinance 901-10. Thank you for your cooperation.

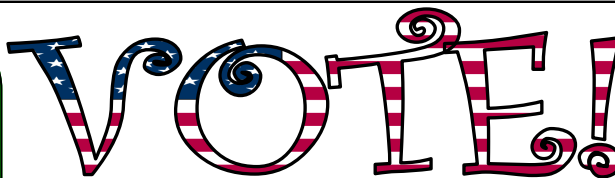
Goodwill will have a truck at the upper pavilion at Memorial park off Koehler Avenue from **11 AM UNTIL 4 PM** that will accept your items.

Will take place on Wednesday, **October 31st from 5:30 - 6:45**. Turn on your porch light to participate.



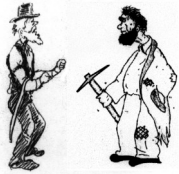
The Snollygoster parade begins at 7 pm on the square and marches to the Middle School where the Lions Club will host a costume judging contest.

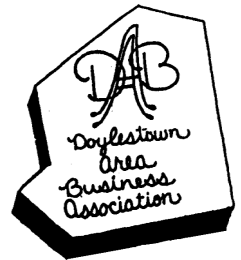

The G.I. Education Bill is Not Just For College

What is Today's GI Bill?



The Post-9/11 GI Bill is the most robust education benefits program since the original GI Bill of Rights signed in 1944.

The Bill enhances and expands the educational benefits available to service members and veterans who served on active duty following September 11, 2001.

The GI Bill's benefits include tuition payments made directly to schools, a monthly housing allowance, an annual stipend for books and school supplies, as well as other benefits.

The Bill grants up to 36 months of higher education aid, based on service and enrollment status.

It also authorizes active duty service members to transfer their education benefits to immediate

family members.

What Exactly Does the New GI Bill Provide?

The Post-9/11 GI Bill provides funding to service members and veterans pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees, tutorial assistance, licensing and certification programs, and distance learning. Approved training under the Post-9/11 GI Bill includes graduate and undergraduate degrees, vocational/technical training, on-the-job training, flight training, correspondence training, licensing and national testing programs, and tutorial assistance. All training programs must be approved for GI Bill benefits.

Who's Eligible for Today's GI Bill?

The Post-9/11 GI Bill provides financial support for education and housing to individuals with at least 90 days of aggregate active

duty service on or after September 11, 2001, or individuals with at least 30 continuous days of active duty who have been separated as a result of a service connected disability.

Active duty Army, Navy, Air Force and Marines may use their GI Bill benefits, as may service members who are training overseas.

Because the Post-9/11 GI Bill counts total active duty service, members of the National Guard and Reserves may add up multiple deployments to count toward the benefit, which can provide an increased amount.
