The Recycling Zone

At Village Hall, one of the most frequently asked questions we receive is about available recycling opportunities in Doylestown. We have compiled some information that we feel answers that very question.

The Village of Doylestown participates in a curbside recycling program with our trash hauler, Republic Waste. This service takes place on the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month. The items accepted with this service include: **Plastic, Metal and Bi-Metal, Aluminum and Glass**. These items can be co-mingled and placed in the Village bins that were provided to all home owners in the Village. If you do not have a bin, please stop up to Village Hall to receive one. Items may also be placed in ordinary grocery store plastic bags. Newspapers are also accepted, however, we ask that they be placed in separate bags to avoid contamination. For more information regarding this program, contact Republic Waste at 1-800-247-3644. Recycle dates are also posted on our [Community Calendar](#) on our website, on Channel 15 and also on our marquee at the square 24-7.

Other recycling opportunities include recycling bins located at our Street Garage ~ 144 Clinton Road. The bins are located inside the security gates; therefore you must come between the hours of 7:30 am and 3:00 pm weekdays, and from 9:00 am – noon every 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month. On these Saturdays, the facility is manned by local Girl Scout or Boy Scout Troops and your recyclables will be unloaded for you. The available bins at this location are: **Cardboard; Magazines; Glass & Plastic; Tin and Aluminum; and Newspaper**.

Doylestown churches and schools also offer options for recycling. Doylestown United Methodist Church at 153 Church Street has a paper bin. Emanuel United Church of Christ at 16 Eastern Road has a paper/cardboard bin. Zion Lutheran Church at has a paper bin as well. Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic School at 169 W. Clinton Street has paper/cardboard bins, and a bin for aluminum cans.

Cell phones and used ink jet cartridges are accepted at the Methodist Church, and Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic School.

For more information for Wayne County Recycling, including used tires and paint as well as hazardous materials and yard waste drop offs, go to the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District website for more information: <http://www.timetorecycle.org/> Another useful sight is www.earth911.com where you can locate various types of materials to recycle based on your zip code.

As an added note, the Village can no longer except yard waste from our residents. Mulch companies may take your yard waste, however, you must transport it to them yourself.

We hope you have found this information useful and that you take time to recycle today!

2013 Mosquito Spraying Program



Due to recent EPA regulation changes regarding mosquito spraying programs, the Village can no longer spray for mosquitoes on a regularly scheduled basis. We will, however, continue to spray on an “as needed” or “complaint” basis. We ask that if you are experiencing mosquitoes in your neighborhood, please call and report it to the **Streets Superintendent, Brett Shaw at 330-658-2181 ext. 1160**. You will need to provide your name and address.

Always remember to protect yourself and your family members against mosquitoes by applying bug spray repellent. Also, watch for standing water where mosquito larvae grow. As an example, buckets, puddles and bird baths are perfect breeding grounds for mosquitoes. Rinse your bird bathes out on a regular basis to flush any larvae that could be present. This will kill mosquito eggs AND keep the birds happy.

Resident Trash and Recycle Survey

The Village of Doylestown currently pays \$9.84 per month for weekly trash pickup and twice a month recycle pickup. The village has the option to continue with the current service or upgrade the recycling at an increased monthly cost. Please select below the option you prefer. Return your survey to village hall at your convenience or email Kristen Robison at kristen@doylestown.com. Surveys can be placed in the drop box in the back parking lot, or the drop box located by the front door of village hall.

- Keep the village current trash service (trash pick up each week and recycling twice a month on the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month) at \$9.84 per month.
- Please upgrade trash pick-up to weekly trash and weekly recycling pick up and **include** a 65 gallon recycling bin. The cost per month will increase to \$11.39 per month.

Village Council will vote to support an agreement for the remaining two years of the trash hauling contract with the majority option selected in this survey by our citizens. This means the option voted on will be the rate for the remaining two years of the contract. Residents using the bag service will see no increase in price and will get a 65 gallon container for recycling at no extra cost.

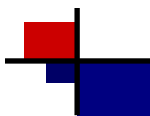

4th Annual Document Shredding



We are offering this service to **Village residents** on Saturday, **September 28th from 9 am to noon** in the back parking lot at Village Hall. This program is made possible thanks to the funds received from our “**Recycling**

Water Softener Issues Addressed

The Village of Doylestown will begin the testing phase of its new water treatment plant on June 24 to June 28th. It is very important that any customers who currently soften their water using in-home water softening systems disengage or bypass their systems, as water that is too soft can be highly corrosive and cause damage to pipes. If testing goes well, we will begin treating water from the new plant immediately.

Summer Brush Pick Up

Pick up is held on the **2nd Monday** of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are as follows: **July 8th, August 12th, September 9th and October 14th**. Please note that pick ups will begin on the specified dates, weather permitting. Depending on the amount of brush that needs to be picked up, it may take several days to complete. Brush must be at the curb by 8 am on the scheduled pick up date. Once pick up has taken place in your neighborhood, the crew will not return until the next scheduled date. Each pick up is limited to a maximum of 15 minutes. If more time is needed, it will be left until the following month.

Shrubs will only be taken if the root ball **has been removed**. Please keep sidewalks clear of brush as stated in the Village’s Codified Ordinance 901-10. Thank you for your cooperation.

From the Zoning Department



Dan Easterling is The Village of Doylestown Zoning Inspector. His hours of operation are Monday & Friday 8 - 9 am and Wednesday 5 - 6 pm.

Please remember that pursuant to the Village's Codified Ordinance 1145.02 that:

(a) *No building or structure shall be built, altered, or repaired, no excavation made, no use established, no change of use of a building or land permitted, except pursuant to the issuance of a Zoning Permit. No Zoning Permit shall be issued by the Zoning Inspector except in conformity with the provisions of this Zoning Ordinance.*

(b) *Applications for Zoning Permits shall be made to the Zoning Inspector on forms provided. Each application shall be accompanied by a plot plan drawn to scale showing the location, size and shape of the parcel of land, the location and uses of structures with respect to the property lines and to the right-of-way, the intended use, height and dimensions of proposed structures, drive-ways and access, off-street parking provisions, and any other information the Zoning Inspector deems necessary for consideration of the application, and a fee as established by Village Council.*

The course was unique in the sense that it taught kids how to not just prevent abduction, but to literally escape abduction. I'm proud to announce that I will be offering this course once again for free here in the Village. The class will be offered **August 10th at 10 am** at the Doylestown Police Department. Another program the Police Department offers is called Vacation/Away from Home Watch. To request this service, simply go to www.doylestown.com then go to the Village Government tab then to the Police Department. Scroll to the bottom of the page to Services Offered and click on **Vacation/Away From Home Watch**. This opens a PDF form which can be printed out. Fill out the form and drop it off to the police station. If you do not have internet access, forms are also available at the police department.

Now that summer is in full swing, let me leave you with a few reminders to make sure each of us has a safe and enjoyable summer. Please make sure that you have a clearly visible number address on your house and/or mailbox. Please remember that all dogs must be on a leash when not in your fenced in yard, and remember to be a vigilant and watchful neighbor as many of those around us are going on vacation this summer and leaving their homes.
