A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR...



Welcome to the Summer Edition of our Community Newsletter! Our *30th Annual Rogues' Hollow Festival* will be on August 2nd & 3rd. Our community will gather downtown ready to enjoy all of the great events that will be taking place. I invite you to come out to the festival this year, which always begins with the Grand Parade on Friday night. Our entire schedule is on pages 6 & 7 and there are many new events to experience. Come and enjoy our family-friendly festival which has something for everyone.

The Gates Street project is underway. This is a 1.3 million dollar project that is being funded by the American Rescue Plan Act, Permissive Tax monies from the County, an OPWC grant and loan, and an OWDA loan. The project consists of new waterlines, new valves, new hydrants, new service line connections, resurfacing with asphalt concrete complete with curb ramps, curbs & gutters. The project is slated to be complete by mid to late August. Thank you for your patience in navigating through the construction and limited access to the park.

Speaking of the park, thanks to a grant received by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, the village was able to purchase a new play structure and merry-go-round. This will be placed where the current sand volleyball court is, and the court will be moved to the area behind pavilion #1. The play structure is also ADA-compliant. This is scheduled to be professionally installed at the end of August. If you want to see the structure, scan the QR code.

OCTOBER 11

- * All upholstered items and mattresses must always be wrapped in plastic.
- * Appliances with freon must be removed and red-tagged by a certified technician.
- * Items not able to be bagged must be under 4 feet in length and weigh less than 50 pounds.

The following items are **NOT** accepted:

ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5TH

Voter Registration deadline for the November 5th election is October 7. If you want to register for the election, forms are available at Village Hall.

Early in-person voting begins at the Board of Elections on October 8.

Mosquito Spraying Continues



Mosquito spraying will continue now and throughout the month of September. Spraying takes place on a **COMPLAINT BASIS ONLY**. Please call the Street Department and leave your name and address. 330-658-2181 ext. 1160. Spraying will be done on Wednesday evenings. If it is raining or if there are relative high winds, spraying will be moved to Thursday evening. Spraying will help keep the mosquito population down, but will not eliminate them. Please use protective precautions when enjoying the outdoors.



Village Ballot Initiative

This 2.9 mill levy renewal benefits all aspects of village operations, including police protection and services, parks and recreation and street services which include brush and leaf pick. ADDITIONAL CARDBOARD AND PAPER RECYCLING OPPORTUNITIES

A few weeks ago, all of the local churches that provided cardboard and paper recycling had their bins removed from River Valley Paper (RVP), the company that provided them to the churches. Years ago when this program started, RVP paid the churches for the recycling materials that were collected. Then, as the market changed, the churches received nothing, but still opted to keep the bins. RVP has now decided to remove the bins completely. All village residents are able to put cardboard and paper into their Kimble bins, however, if you want to keep it separate or you have a large amount, there are bins on **Galehouse Road in Chippewa Township** down the road from the township garage (14228 Galehouse Rd.) on the left-hand side before the railroad tracks. There are four (4) cardboard bins, one (1) paper bin, and also bins for plastic bottles and jugs, metal, and glass. This facility is open 24/7 and is made available by the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Recycling District. Thank you for recycling!

COUNCIL PASSES DORA LEGISLATION JULY 17

WHAT IS A DORA?

In the State of Ohio, a DORA allows visitors aged 21 and older to consume alcoholic beverages outdoors and in participating businesses within the area's boundaries, during designated hours, and according to DORA rules.

DORA HOURS: Doylestown's DORA operates from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily. Patrons must be age 21 or over to purchase or consume alcohol.

DORA RULES:

- DORA beverages must be purchased at participating liquor establishments; you cannot bring your own drink.
- DORA drinks must be discarded before you enter another bar or restaurant that serves alcohol.
- You may enjoy your beverage outdoors.
- DORA drinks are allowed only within the DORA boundaries. Exit signage is placed at the boundaries of the DORA, and DORA beverages are not permitted outside of these exit points.
- Safety and nuisance laws are still enforced! Enjoy the DORA responsibly, be respectful of residents and businesses, and never drink and drive.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Q: Can I bring my own drink into the DORA?

A: No. Patrons cannot bring their own alcoholic drinks into the DORA. You can purchase your favorite drink in a marked DORA container from a participating establishment.

Q: Can I take my DORA beverage from one liquor establishment into another?

A: No. You cannot take a DORA drink back into the liquor establishment where you purchased it after exiting or into another liquor establishment.

Q: Can I take my DORA beverage into my favorite shop?

A: No, you must drink your beverage outdoors.

Q: How will the DORA be enforced?

A: Doylestown police monitor the DORA area during routine patrols.

RULES AND MAP



All liquor regulations apply to establishments and patrons within the DORA, including overserving and drunk driving laws. Please drink responsibly. The designated area will be marked by signage, which will be placed shortly. Scan the QR code which takes you to the Village website for more information.
