BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT

BLUE MACAROON THEATER COMPANY

The Blue Macaroon Theater Company, at 84 1/2 N Portage Street was started by Doylestown residents Matt & Kristie Smith in March of 2023. Their daughter was taking acting lessons at the previous theatre company in town when the owner decided to pursue college in another state. Matt & Kristie wanted to keep an arts focused place in town, not only for their daughter but for the entire community, so they started the Blue Macaroon Theater Company. Matt wrote two children's books, called "I Love Blue Macaroons" and "I Love Blue Macaroons Too" in 2019 & 2021, so that is where the name comes from.

Shortly after starting the theater, Matt and Kristie made the decision to expand and go on the venture of making the theatre a hub for performance arts, one that provides education, such as music and acting lessons, as well as entertaining performances. **Currently, the Blue Macaroon provides weekly piano, guitar, and acting lessons with more subjects on the horizon.**

Since March of 2023, Blue Macaroon Theater has produced six plays with a seventh to be performed the weekend of March 21st, 2025. In 2024, 11 out of the 12 performances sold out!

The Blue Macaroon Theater is also a venue for live comedy and local musicians. Several local musicians have played at the theater, including favorites, **JIM BALLARD, LAUREN BRABSON, WILEY GREEN, THE FIFTH WHEEL, CHRISSY STRONG, VAN ARLO, RYE VALLEY, MEGAN BEE, WRECK LIKE ME** and others! The theater, on average, runs about two local music shows a month, either on their main stage or in the adjacent ROOM TOO, which also has a small stage and a lounge like environment with tables and chairs and a concession stand that does serve adult beverages at select shows.

Starting on March 8th, the Blue Macaroon will host free karaoke every second Saturday of the month. There will also be an open mic night hosted by Lauren Brabson on Wednesday, March 26th.

Coming up at the Blue Macaroon Theater:

March 7 - our 2-year anniversary with live music from *Wreck Like Me*, *Wiley Green*, & *St. Thomas Collective* at 7 pm; **March 8** - Karaoke at 7:30 with free entry; **March 9** - *Royal Melodies - A Spring Family Concert At Lions Lincoln Theatre In Massillon*; **March 15** - live music with *Katy Robinson and Thompson & White* at 7 pm; **March 21, 22, 23** - our stage production of the ***Elephant Man*** directed by Madison Witte. Friday & Saturday shows start at 7 pm. Sunday matinee is at 2 pm.

INCOME TAX UPDATE FOR VILLAGE RESIDENTS

On December 20, 2023, Village Council passed Ordinance 2023-39, amending existing Section 6 "Credit for Tax Paid by Residents to other Municipalities" in our Income Tax Rules and Regulations. This ordinance will lower the credit given by the Village which is paid to other municipalities from 2% to 1%. The Village always gave 100% credit of these taxes, up to 2%. Residents who work in and pay taxes to other municipalities at a rate of 2% or higher, will now only be able to claim credit for 1% of these taxes, and the other 1% is now paid to the Village.

This change was updated with RITA in January of 2024 and in February of 2024 RITA sent out postcards to residents with this information. Because of this change, you may or may not have to pay estimated taxes to the Village via RITA. You may request your employer to withhold a "Courtesy Withholding" for the Village, however employers are not required to withhold this tax for you, but may do so if requested by you.

This change was made so that we may continue to provide all the services that benefit to the residents in our Village.

INCOME TAX DEADLINE IS APRIL 15, 2025

VILLAGE INCOME TAX RETURNS need to be submitted to RITA (Regional Income Tax Authority).

Brush Pick Up Resumes

Brush pick up is held on the second Monday of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are: **March 10, April 14, May 12, June 9, July 14, August 11 and September 8**. Please note that weather may cause a delay on any of these regularly scheduled dates. Depending on the amount of brush around town, it may take more than one day to collect. The crew will only go through each neighborhood one time, **please have your brush to the curb by 8 am on the scheduled pick up date.**

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE RULES:

Each residence is allocated a maximum of 15 minutes worth of brush for disposal. Brush also needs to be stacked with branch ends all one direction. Do not mix leaves and brush as there are separate machines that handle this. Only brush can be picked up during this time. Thank you, from the Street Department.

Village~Wide Multiple Large Item Pick-Up Dates

APRIL 11 & OCTOBER 10

- * All upholstered items and mattresses must always be wrapped in plastic.
- * Appliances with freon must be removed and red-tagged by a certified technician.
- * Items not able to be bagged must be under 4 feet in length and weigh less than 50 pounds.

The following items are NOT accepted:

Appliances containing freon, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, hazardous or toxic wastes, oil, auto parts, batteries, steel drums, ashes, liquids, paint, tires, computer monitors, material containing asbestos, infections or biohazardous waste, concrete, stones, dirt, sand, brick, construction materials, demolition materials, fluorescent bulbs, gas cans or any other flammable and/or combustible materials. **Services are provided by Kimble**

American Flag Disposal Drop Box



Did you know that the U.S. flag is considered a sacred symbol and that by burning it in an *undignified manner* constitutes desecration?

The rules on how to properly fly the flag were established in June 1923, when the National Flag Conference met in Washington. Its members created the Flag Code, which states that "***the flag represents a living country and is itself considered a living thing.***"

The American Legion passed a resolution about flag retirement ceremonies in 1937, and they've been an important ritual ever since. According to the resolution, "The approved method of disposing of unserviceable flags has long been that they be destroyed by burning."

Every year on June 14, Americans celebrate Flag Day. Not surprisingly, it's considered the most appropriate day to hold flag disposal ceremonies, which are often held at night.

If you have a flag to be disposed of, there is a drop box outside of the front doors of the Doylestown American Legion Post 407 at 49 Black Drive. Please drop off your old flags here. Thank you!
