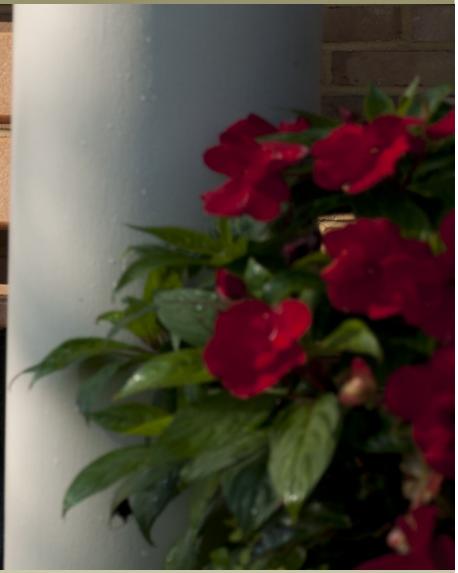

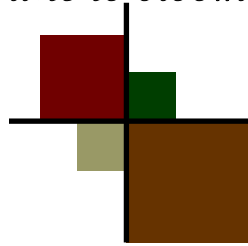

## 15th Annual Document Shredding



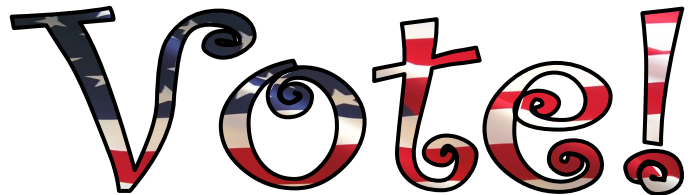
We are offering this service to our Village residents on Saturday, September 27 from 9 am to 12 noon in the back parking lot of Village Hall.

## VILLAGE MULTIPLE LARGE ITEM CLEAN UP

### October 10th

- ◆ All upholstered items and mattresses *must always be wrapped* in plastic.
- ◆ Appliances with freon must be removed and red-tagged by a certified technician.
- ◆ Items not able to be bagged must be under 4 feet in length and weigh less than 50 pounds.

#### THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTED

Appliances containing freon, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, hazardous or toxic wastes, oil, auto parts, batteries, steel drums, ashes, liquids, paint, tires, computer monitors, material containing asbestos, infectious or biohazardous waste, concrete, stones, dirt, sand, brick, construction materials, demolition materials, fluorescent bulbs, gas cans or any other flammable and/or combustible materials. *Services are provided for individual Kimble customers only.*

## Update from the Street Department



Since Councilman Gadosik’s term began in 2022, our community has seen unprecedented progress in infrastructure improvements. Under his leadership, the Village has completed over 11 miles of street paving and over 2 miles of critical crack sealing, greatly enhancing road safety, longevity, and driving experience for residents.

Looking ahead, plans are already in motion for another 2.64 miles of paving and 1.68 miles of crack sealing in 2025. These projects demonstrate forward-thinking planning and fiscal responsibility, ensuring our roads remain in excellent condition while maximizing taxpayer value.

Councilman Gadosik continues to deliver on his commitment to getting things done reliably, efficiently, and with integrity. His hands-on approach to aligning goals with execution has created visible, measurable outcomes. With each resurfaced street and sealed crack, his promise to serve the residents with excellence is being fulfilled.

### CHESTNUT HILL CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations were adopted to ensure the sanctity, respect and reverence that all grave sites deserve.

- No wreaths or plastic flowers will be left on the grave sites during mowing season. Plastic flowers may be left on the graves from November 1, through April 15, after which they will be discarded.
- No pots or glass containers are to be left on the graves at any time.
- No shrubs, trees or bushes will be planted or left on the grave sites.
- No external shepherd hooks, stands, statuary items, or knick knacks shall be left on the grave sites.
- No flags larger than a staff of 24" high, with no flag larger than 22" X 16" in width and length.
- Live planting and solar lights may be used within 1 foot of the front of the headstone.
- Should any monument, marker, effigy, decoration, ornament, enclosure, planting or other object or structure be erected, placed in, around or upon any lot which the Board may deem improper, injurious or unsightly, it may cause the same to be removed.
- Any additional or second monument on a grave must be ground level.
- No more than two cremains on a single grave, or one regular burial and one cremain.

## Income Tax Information Update From Village Council

Starting with the 2024 tax year, Doylestown's income tax credit was reduced from 2% to 1%, meaning all residents now owe at least 1% to the Village, regardless of what is withheld by the municipality where you work. While your workplace city may provide services like road maintenance, Doylestown offers a much broader range of services directly benefiting your home and community. These include local police protection, street and sewer maintenance, clean water, brush and leaf pickup, tree removal, public parks, and other essential services that enhance the quality of life for our residents.

This change allows us to maintain these services without raising the actual tax rate, which hasn't increased in over 17 years. Like all households and small communities, we're not immune to rising costs and inflation, and this adjustment helps us keep pace with growing demands while continuing to deliver excellent service.

Public notice of this change was provided through our newsletter, website, council meeting minutes, and notices from RITA (Regional Income Tax Agency).

### **PAYMENT TIP:**

*Some residents have asked whether they can pay once per year instead of quarterly. That's a great question! We recommend contacting RITA and your employer to ensure everything is set up correctly:*

- Ask your employer if they can offer a courtesy withholding for Doylestown of 1%
- Let RITA know if you prefer annual payments, so they can guide you on staying compliant.
