From the Street Department

In June, the Village contracted with Melway Paving to do some major street repairs throughout the Village. The streets that have been repaired to date are *Elmwood Drive, Church Street, Maple Street, Collier Drive, Frederick Street and Homan Drive*. These streets have all been patched, leveled and covered with chip and seal. *Calaboone, Kohler Avenue and Edward Street and Gates Street Extension* have all been chip and sealed. Soon all these streets will be line painted and those who had cross walks will have those painted as well.

The Street Committee is already putting together a plan for the next round of repairs slated for next spring.

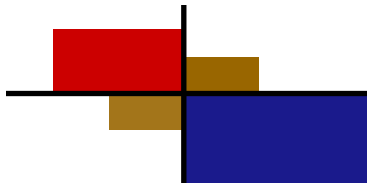

6th Annual Document Shredding



We are offering this service to *Village residents* on Saturday, **September 26th** from **9 am to noon** in the back parking lot of Village Hall. This program is made possible thanks to the funds which we receive from the “*Recycling Makes Sense Grant*” through Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District. This grant is based on the tonnage produced by our residents who participate in the curbside recycling program. So that we can accommodate everyone, please limit shredding to 5 boxes per person.

We ask that you please bring one or more canned food items for donation to the Doylestown Food Pantry. Thank you from our Village Council members.

Mosquito Spraying Continues



Mosquito spraying will continue now and throughout the month of September. Spraying takes place every Wednesday evening. If it is raining or if there are relative high winds, spraying will be moved to Thursday evening.

Spraying will help keep the mosquito population down, but will not eliminate them. Please use protective precautions when enjoying the outdoors.



Summer Brush Pick Up

Monthly pick up is held on the **2nd Monday** of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are as follows: **August 10th, September 14th and October 12th**. Please note that pick ups will begin on the specified dates, weather permitting. Depending on the amount of brush that needs to be picked up, it may take several days to complete. Brush must be at the curb by 8 am on the scheduled pick up date. Once pick up has taken place in your neighborhood, the crew will not return until the next scheduled date. Each pick up is limited to a maximum of 15 minutes. If more time is needed, it will be left until the following month.

Shrubs will only be taken if the root ball ***has been removed***. Please keep sidewalks clear of brush as stated in the Village’s Codified Ordinance 901-10. Thank you for your cooperation.

Recycling Information

The Village of Doylestown participates in a curbside recycling program with our trash hauler, Republic Waste. This service takes place on the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month. Having the opportunity to recycle bimonthly allows our residents to recycle without worrying about a buildup of recyclables lying around. The items accepted with this service include: **Plastic, Metal and Bi-Metal, Aluminum and Glass**. These items can be co-mingled and placed in the Village bins that were provided to all home owners in the Village. If you do not have a bin, *please stop up to Village Hall to receive one or more*. Items may also be placed in ordinary grocery store plastic bags. Newspapers are also accepted, however, we ask that they be placed in separate bags to avoid contamination.

For more information regarding this program, contact Republic Waste at 1-800-247-3644. Recycle dates are also posted on our Community Calendar on our website, on Channel 15 and also on the marquee on the town square, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Local churches and schools also offer options for recycling. Doylestown United Methodist Church at 153 Church Street has a paper bin. Emanuel United Church of Christ at 16 Eastern Road has a paper/cardboard bin. Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic School at 169 W. Clinton Street has paper/cardboard bins, as well as a bin for aluminum cans. Zion Lutheran Church at 65 W. Clinton Street has a paper/cardboard bin.

From the Desk of Chief Dressler *Signs, Signs, Everywhere A Sign...*

Obey them, heed their warning, put them up in the right location and please take them back down. Signs serve multiple purposes. They remind us of speed limits and ordinances. They warn us of potential dangers, pedestrians or school children crossing the road, they inform us of special events and yard sales. Signs can be a real benefit, help us safely get to where we need to go but can also really clutter up the landscape.

I wanted to remind everyone that if you are going to put up a sign about a party or an upcoming yard sale, please make sure that it is not in the village right of way and does not obstruct a drivers view of an intersection. Signs can be placed on private property with permission from the property owner. Equally as important, please remove the sign after the event is over. We live in a community that enjoys walking around town and enjoying the uniqueness of our village and beautiful landscape. Help us in our efforts to maintain our uncluttered walkways, light poles and lawns by removing old signs.

Also with our annual Rogues' Hollow Festival, Village wide yard sales and children going back to school, please remember to observe the speed limit and crosswalk signs that are posted for everyone's safety. Also remember that between 3 am and 5 am, there is no parking on Village streets. This is for street cleaning in the summer and snow removal in the winter. These signs are posted on all roads where you enter the Village.

Thanks for your continued partnership with the Police Department. Have a safe and enjoyable rest of the summer.
