## Portage Street Resurfacing Project



The Village of Doylestown has received a \$140,000 grant from OPWC (Ohio Public Works Commission) to resurface Portage Street. The total cost of the project is \$360,000, with the balance coming from the Village's Capital Improvement Fund. The project is scheduled to begin in September, and will start at Cleveland Avenue heading north to the corporation line. Three lampposts will be added in the downtown business district as well. We are excited for this to begin, as it has been 11 years since our last downtown improvement project.

# 2nd Annual Empty Bowl Project



Many in our community struggle to provide adequate food for their families. To combat this the *Doylestown Empty Bowl Project* is underway to present our [2nd annual event](#) to support the Doylestown Community Food Cupboard.

The *Empty Bowls* is a grassroots effort by artists and crafts people in cities and towns across America to feed the hungry in their communities. It is run completely by volunteers. All proceeds from *The Doylestown Empty Bowl* event will be used to benefit the service of the Doylestown Community Food Cupboard.

Thanks to generous supporters, our 2016 *Empty Bowl* event was so successful that it generated over \$16,000 for the Doylestown Community Food Cupboard which provide food for those in our community. This event also made possible the creation of a backpack program that provided a weekend supply of food to over 80 children at Hazel Harvey and SS Peter & Paul Schools during the school year. The plan for 2017/2018 school year is to expand the backpack program by offering it to middle school and high school eligible children.

On Sunday, October 8, 2017, from noon until 2:00 pm, participants will come together at Chippewa High School for a simple meal to be served in an atmosphere of giving. For a minimum donation of \$30, each guest will receive soup, bread, a cookie and water and will be able to choose from a variety of handcrafted bowls to keep as a reminder of all the empty bowls in the world. If one wishes to make a minimum contribution of \$10, the meal alone is provided without the gifted bowl. There will also be a silent auction, basket raffles, and a 50/50 drawing with all the money raised going toward support of the *Community Food Cupboard*. One hundred percent of the proceeds are devoted to curtailing hunger in our community.

The *Doylestown Empty Bowl Committee* is looking for local artists and crafters who would be able to donate handcrafted ceramic, wood turned, glass blown, fiber, or metallic bowls to furnish the needs of this worthy project. ## From the Water & Sewer Department

Matt Gaugler was hired as the Village of Doylestown's Public Utilities Manager in June 2016. He was recruited to the village from the Medina County Sanitary Engineers where he served for over 10 years. He holds a Class 4 Wastewater License which is an advanced license by Ohio EPA standards (a written thesis is reviewed by an appointed panel and at least 3 years of supervisory experience at a Class 4 plant is required). Matt earned a Bachelor's of Science in Biology from The University of Akron and resides in Wadsworth with his wife and two children.

During the past year, Matt has worked on improving efficiencies within the Village's water and sewer systems and has implemented several cost saving processes. As a department, it is our goal to deliver the highest quality services while maintaining compliance with Ohio EPA regulations to Village customers. The service team works hard daily to maintain our state of the art Water Treatment Plant and continually seeks creative ways to manage the future of our aging Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).

### Current department updates include:

- The department is in the final stages of implementing a mechanical screen building at the WWTP to remain compliant with the Ohio EPA bio-solids rules and regulations. In addition, the mechanical screen will go a long way in extending the life of many costly components of our treatment plant.
- Department staff is currently in the second half of a 10 year plan to replace all water meters in the Village. Replacing water meters increases customer efficiency as well as accuracy of monthly water meter readings.
- Current employee Matt Thomas was promoted to the position of Chief Operator for the Water and Sewer Department. His experience and knowledge from his tenure makes him a valuable asset and improves the capabilities of the department.

In order to provide the best service possible, we ask that you make sure your contact information is current with the BPA Clerk, Cassandra McKay. Customers may also contact Cassandra to enroll in "auto pay" for your Water/Sewer bill. This is a convenient way to avoid late fees and reduce the stress of remembering to pay your bill on time. Matt looks forward to leading the Village's utilities department into the future and is thankful for the continued support he has received from the Village customers.

### Mosquito Spraying Continues



Mosquito spraying will continue now and throughout the month of September.

Spraying takes place Wednesday evenings on a complaint basis or Thursday if there is inclement weather. Please call 330-658-2181 ext. 1160 with your mosquitoes complaints.

Spraying will help keep the mosquito population down, but will not eliminate them. Be mindful of standing water where mosquito larvae grows. Please use protective precautions when enjoying the outdoors.

This program is made possible thanks to funds we receive from our “**Recycling Makes Sense Grant**”. Participation in this grant is through The Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District. The grant money we receive is based on the actual tonnage produced by our residents who take part in the curbside recycling program. In order to accommodate everyone, please limit your shredding to 5 boxes per person.

We also ask that you please bring one or more canned food items for donation to the Doylestown Community Food Pantry. Thank you from our Village Council members.



## Summer Brush Pick Up

Monthly pick up is held on the **2nd Monday** of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are as follows: **August 14th, September 11th and October 9th**. Please note that pick ups will begin on the specified dates, weather permitting. Depending on the amount of brush that needs to be picked up, it may take several days to complete. Brush must be at the curb by 8 am on the scheduled pick up date. Once pick up has taken place in your neighborhood, the crew will not return until the next scheduled date. Each pick up is limited to a maximum of 15 minutes and must not contain any thorns. Please place cut brush ends in one direction, facing the street without blocking the sidewalk. If more time is needed, it will be left until the following month. Shrubs will only be taken if the root ball **has been removed**. Please keep sidewalks clear of brush as stated in the Village’s Codified Ordinance 901-10. Thank you for your cooperation.

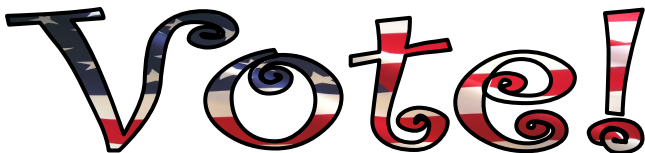
## Goodwill Drop Off After Yard Sales

The Board of Directors has been reviewing the 39 projects and vetting them. One year after the process began, the Growth Initiatives will report back to the community. ## From the Doylestown Police Department

The Doylestown Police Department will be providing security for events and attendees at the up-coming Rogues' Hollow Festival on August 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>.

To help us ensure the safety of the people attending as well as those in the area, the Police Department is asking for the community's help by following a few safety tips:

- Keep little ones off the street as much as possible during the parade
- Encourage children who are on their own to stay in groups within the barricades and have a check in time
- Be aware of your surroundings
- Immediately report suspicious activity to law enforcement officers
- Lock ALL vehicle doors and roll up your windows
- Do not leave any valuables in your vehicle
- Securely carry your purses and put wallet/valuables in a safe place
- Choose alternate routes to avoid congestion if you do not need to be downtown
- Drivers should slow down and be aware of increased pedestrian foot traffic
- Pedestrians should use extra cautious and watch traffic. Different roads and alleys are closed at different times
- Do not leave bags, purses, or drinks unattended
- Remember that open containers of alcohol are not allowed except for in the beer tent

Alert citizens are *essential* in helping us to keep our community safe. We urge you to pay attention to your surroundings and immediately report any suspicious activity to one of our Police Officers. If you are unable to locate a Police Officer report it to the nearest Fire/EMS personnel, to the information booth near the statue, or contact our non-emergency dispatch number at 330-658-2771. As always, you can call 911 in case of an emergency.
