# 4TH ANNUAL EMPTY BOWL PROJECT

Benefitting the Doylestown Community Food Cupboard, this event will be held on Sunday October 13, 2019 at the Chippewa Jr./Sr. High School from 12:00 – 2:00 p.m.

**PURCHASE A TICKET FOR A SIMPLE MEAL TO BE SERVED IN AN ATMOSPHERE OF GIVING:** For a donation of \$30, each guest will receive soup, bread, a cookie and water and will be able to choose from a variety of handcrafted bowls to keep as a reminder of all the empty bowls in the world. New this year, children under 12 will receive a bowl for \$10. If one wishes to make a minimum contribution of \$10, the meal alone is provided without the gifted bowl. There will also be a silent auction, basket raffles, and a 50/50 drawing with all of the money raised going toward support of the *Community Food Cupboard*. 100% of the meal's proceeds are devoted to curtailing hunger in our community.

**GET TICKETS:** All tickets are pre-sale only. Complete this form and mail a \$30 per adult, or \$10 per child under 12 via check or money order made out to The Doylestown Empty Bowl Project to: **Doylestown Empty Bowl PO Box 111, Doylestown Ohio, 44230** . Over the last 3 years, thanks to this event the Doylestown Community Food Cupboard was able to dramatically extend food distribution, thanks to the generosity and dedication of the community members. Due to the over \$26,000 raised by last year's Empty Bowl Project, we purchased a walk in freezer and successfully continued to increase the volume of monthly food distribution including fresh fruit and vegetables; increased the number of families that participated in both monthly food distributions, and the Weekend Backpack Program; and created a new backpack program for all of Doylestown Schools. We serve 162 children with weekend food; started an additional program that provides 30 pounds of supplemental food every month to participating senior citizens; and started a summer weekend program for children in our community.

**THE DOYLESTOWN EMPTY BOWL PROJECT 2019 GOALS INCLUDE:** To raise as much money as possible to continue to support *The Doylestown Community Food Cupboard* in 2019-2020; to maintain the increase in food distribution and support additional outreach and to increase awareness of hunger and related issues here in our hometown. Through education, awareness and actions, concerned individuals can influence change in people's understanding and attitudes which allow hunger to exist. To advocate for arts education; nurturing the creative process though the arts enhances that possibility of finding innovative solutions to old problems.

**HOW CAN YOU HELP:** The *Doylestown Empty Bowl Committee* is looking for local artists and crafters who would be able to donate handcrafted ceramic, wood turned, glass blown, fiber, or metallic bowls to furnish the needs of this worthy project. ## FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT



The Doylestown Police Department will be providing security for events and attendees at the up-coming Rogues' Hollow Festival on August 2nd & 3rd. To help us ensure the safety of the people attending as well as those in the area, the Police Department is asking for the community's help by following a few safety tips:

- Keep little ones off the street as much as possible during the parade
- Encourage children who are on their own to stay in groups within the barricades and have a check in time
- Be aware of your surroundings
- Immediately report suspicious activity to law enforcement officers
- Lock ALL vehicle doors and roll up your windows
- Do not leave any valuables in your vehicle
- Securely carry your purse and put wallet/valuables in a safe place
- Choose alternate routes to avoid congestion if you do not need to be downtown
- Drivers should slow down and be aware of increased pedestrian foot traffic
- Pedestrians should be extra cautious and watch traffic. Different roads and alleys are closed at different times
- Do not leave bags, purses, or drinks unattended
- Remember that open containers of alcohol are not allowed except in the beer tent

Alert citizens are **essential** in helping us to keep our community safe. We urge you to pay attention to your surroundings and immediately report any suspicious activity to one of our Police Officers. If you are unable to locate a Police Officer report it to the nearest Fire/EMS personnel, to the information booth near the statue, or contact our non-emergency dispatch number at 330-658-2771. As always, you can call 911 in case of an emergency. Enjoy the festival and have a safe summer!

As a reminder, we encourage you sign up for "NIXLE". This is another effective way to share information with our residents about the neighborhoods where they work, live, and visit. All alerts will be targeted geographically, allowing residents to receive localized, relevant alerts from the Doylestown Police Department. Alerts can be sent via text or email in an instant. NIXLE is partnered with NLETS for unmatched data security, as well as the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the National Blue Alert Network, and Google for unmatched reach and two-way information exchange. ## VILLAGE BALLOT INITIATIVES

On July 16, 2019 Village Council passed Resolution 2019-29, which allows the Village to place on the November ballot a new *Residential Property Maintenance Standards Code*. This resolution is currently on our website for review. Go to [www.doylestown.com](http://www.doylestown.com) and on the home page, see the "News Flash". Click as directed and the resolution can be reviewed. This is something that many residents have requested of our Planning Commission over the recent years, as we already have a Commercial Property Maintenance Code. Village residents will have the opportunity to decide if they want this implemented into our Municipal Code.

Also on the November ballot, will be a renewal levy for the Village. This 2.9 mill levy renewal benefits all aspects of village operations, including police protection and services, parks and recreation and street services including brush and leaf pick. Again, this levy is a renewal only, so there are *no new taxes*. We hope you support this levy so that we may continue to provide these services to you, our residents. Thank you.

This year's Farmers Market will be in operation **July 13th to September 7th**. The Market opens every Saturday at Memorial Park from 8 am - 11 am.

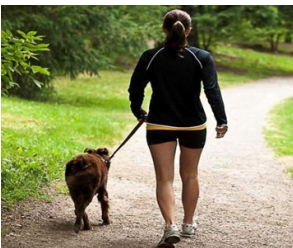
