SERVING SINCE 2013

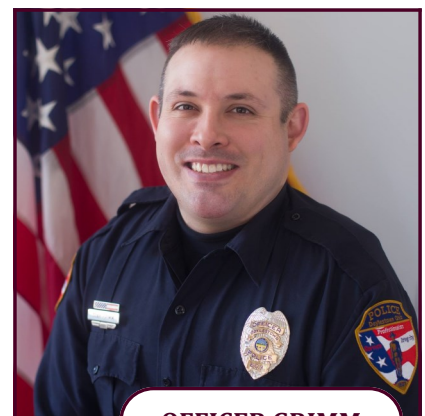

SERVING SINCE 1993

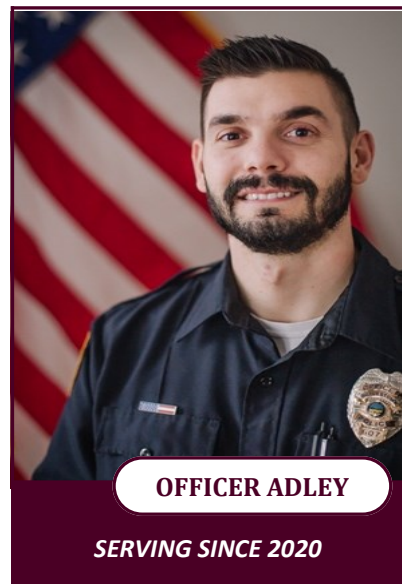

Brush Pick Up Resumes

Brush pick up is held on the 2nd Monday of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are: **April 13, May 11, June 8, July 13, August 10, September 14 and October 12**. Please note that weather may cause a delay on any of these regularly scheduled dates. Depending on the amount of brush out around town, it may take more than one day to collect.

Please follow these rules:

Each residence is allocated a maximum of 15 minutes worth of brush or leaves for disposal. Brush also needs to be stacked with branch ends all one direction. Cut ends need to be together and facing the street. This will help the Street Department as they load the branches into the chipper.

Village Wide Multiple Large Item Pick Up Dates for 2020

APRIL 10TH & OCTOBER 9TH

Multiple large items (couches, chairs, etc.) accepted; all upholstered items and mattresses must be wrapped in plastic. **NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OR TIRES. FREON MUST BE REMOVED** from any appliance and **RED TAGGED** by a licensed technician. Paint cans are accepted but the paint has to be dried completely. Kitty litter can also be used to absorb the liquid inside each can. Please leave the lids off so Rumpke can see that they are acceptable for pickup. Smaller TV's (sized 32" or smaller) accepted, and weigh less than 80 lbs. Computer monitors are also accepted. *For more information, please contact Rumpke directly at 1-800-828-8171. Thank you!*

GREATER WAYNE COMMUNITY FEDERAL CREDIT UNION IS COMING TO DOWNTOWN DOYLESTOWN

Doylestown is about to get its first ever credit union and it will be right downtown. The 78-year-old Greater Wayne Community Federal Credit Union branch office will be located at 85 North Portage Street in the Stepfield (Doylestown Telephone Company) Building. **GWCFU** is moving into the space once occupied by the Chippewa Valley Bank in the 1990's. Renovations are underway and the credit union should open by May, but no grand opening has been set. **GWCFU** is also in the process of merging with Morton Salt Credit Union. The two credit unions have hundreds of members in Doylestown that will be served by this new office and new members will be welcome. Services provided by **GWCFU** are: Loans - Personal, Auto, RV, Insured Savings Accounts, Share Draft (Checking) Accounts, VISA Credit Card, Mobile and online banking, Payroll Deduction and Direct Deposit, Certificates of Deposit, IRA Accounts, Money Orders, Wire Transfers, Notary Public Service, Fax Service, Federal Express, Checkbook Balancing, Remote deposit, Coin counter, Bill Pay and ATM.

CHESTNUT CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- ◆ No wreaths or plastic flowers will be left on the grave sites during mowing season. Plastic flowers may be left on the grave sites from November 1 through April 15, after which they will be discarded:
- ◆ No pots or glass containers are to be left on the grave sites at any time.
- ◆ No shrubs, trees or bushes will be planted or left on the grave sites.
- ◆ No external shepherd hooks, stands, statuary items or knick knacks shall be left on the grave sites.
- ◆ No flags larger than a staff of 24" high, with no flag larger than 22"x16" in width and length.
- ◆ Live planting and solar lights may be used within 1 foot of the front of the headstone.
- ◆ Should any monument marker, effigy, decoration, ornament, enclosure, planting or other object or structure be erected, or placed in or around or upon any lot which the Trustees may deem improper, injurious or unsightly, it may cause the same to be removed.
- ◆ Any additional or second monument on a grave must be ground level.
- ◆ No more than two remains on a single grave, or one regular burial and one cremain.
