VILLAGE OF DOYLESTOWN WATER DEPARTMENT NEWS

Collier Drive Water Line Replacement

It is widely known that America's infrastructure is aging, and the Village of Doylestown is no exception. The Village has been working to identify areas where upgrades are needed while researching the best funding options. The first improvement project we have identified is the replacement of the Collier Drive water line.

For many years, the age of the water line along Collier Drive has caused dozens of water line breaks. These breaks have cost the Village thousands of dollars in repairs and resulted in disruptions for our customers who live and work in the Collier Drive neighborhood. The Water Department is happy to announce we will soon be replacing the Collier Drive water line. The replacement will start at the corner of South Portage Street and Cleveland Avenue and extend along Collier Drive to the Carriage Landings Apartments. Over 2,000 feet of new line will be installed at a cost of \$355,000. The Village has secured funding for the line replacement in the form of 0% interest as well as low interest loans from the Ohio Public Works Commission. Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2021.

~Sewer System Do's & Don'ts~

The Village of Doylestown's Utilities Department asks our customers to do their part to protect our community investment in our sewer system by limiting items that are flushed down the toilet. Wise use of our sewer system will help safeguard the system and reduce costs for everyone. **Please Do Not Flush: diapers; personal sanitary products; gauze, newspapers, soiled rags or paper towels; fats, oils and grease; medical waste and prescriptions; and flushable wipes.** (Even though many wipes claim to be "flushable" they clog our pipes and cause blockages and significant damage to our pumps which then requires our pumps to be disassembled multiple times a year for cleaning and "de-ragging.")

ZONING DEPARTMENT

I started working as the Zoning Inspector on August 3, 2020. I would like to take this opportunity to remind our residents of a few common zoning regulations within the Village:

- **ZONING PERMITS** are required for fences, outbuildings and pools. Forms and more information can be found on www.doylestown.com.
- **COD. ORD. 1333.01: CUTTING REQUIRED**

The owner of any lot or land must cut their grass and offensive and noxious weeds routinely. Any grass or weeds that are higher than EIGHT INCHES are in violation. This ordinance is in effect between May 1 and October 1.

- **COD. ORD. 1337.02: GARBAGE AND RUBBISH PICK-UP**

Any garbage or rubbish cannot be put out earlier than 4:00 PM the evening before the regularly scheduled pick-up day. All empty containers need to be removed from the curb no later than 8:00 AM the morning after trash pick-up.

## BRUSH PICK UP RESUMES

Brush pick up is held on the 2nd Monday of each month from now until October. Pick up dates are: **July 12, August 9, September 13 and October 11**. Please note that weather may cause a delay on any of these regularly scheduled dates. *Depending on the amount of brush out around town, it may take more than one day to collect.*

### Please follow these rules:

Each residence is allocated a maximum of 15 minutes worth of brush or leaves for disposal. Brush also needs to be stacked with branch ends all one direction. Cut ends need to be together and facing the street. This will help the Street Department as they load the branches into the chipper. **\*No branches or bushes with briars are accepted.**

## VILLAGE WIDE MULTIPLE LARGE ITEM PICK UP DATE FOR FALL

### OCTOBER 8TH

Multiple large items (couches, chairs, etc.) accepted; **all upholstered items and mattresses must always be wrapped in plastic. NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OR TIRES. FREON MUST BE REMOVED** from any appliance and **RED TAGGED** by a licensed technician. Paint cans are accepted but the paint has to be dried completely. Kitty litter can also be used to absorb the liquid inside each can. Please leave the lids off so Rumpke can see that they are acceptable for pickup. Smaller TV's (sized 32" or smaller) accepted, and weigh less than 80 lbs. Computer monitors are also accepted. *For more information, please contact Rumpke directly at 1-800-828-8171.* Thank you!

## THE VILLAGE IS LOOKING FOR RESIDENTS TO SERVE ON THE CHARTER COMMISSION

The purpose and role of the Charter Commission is to prepare the first charter for the Village, thus addressing current issues the community may be dealing with. The job of a Charter Commission is to gather the ideas and information from people in the community and put a charter together that reflects those ideas and issues and present it to the citizens for a vote. A charter exists to organize and structure local government, not for substantive matters of policy. Below is the process. **For more information contact Mark Hammer (330-658-7877).**

### CHARTER PROCESS

1. **Authorize the selection of a Charter Commission.** A 2/3 vote by Council authorizes the creation of a 15-member Charter Commission. This must be completed between 60 and 120 days before the next municipal election.
2. **Election of Commission.** By non-partisan ballot, 15 persons are selected to serve on the Charter Commission from the municipality at large. The persons running for the Charter Commission must have 25 signatures from registered voters.
3. **Charter Commission.** Members of the Commission must draft the charter and submit it back to the electors within one year of election.
4. **Decision to Adopt Charter.** Adoption of the charter requires approval by a majority of the electors.

### CHARTER DEVELOPMENT

- ◆ The charter is similar to the State Constitution. It is likely that a charter will be in place for some time. It is not easily repealed, and the community is going to have to abide by its provisions. The Commission's task as it begins deliberations is to think about values (what the community agrees on and what it wants from its government) and try to strike a balance between what the community does and does not agree on. Once agreed upon, the Commission will be charged with identifying the form of government that most closely embraces the values. The charter will contain a form of government, whether it be a strong mayor, weak mayor, city manager or some other form of government. It usually does not attempt to solve all the detailed administrative policy matters forever; rather it usually leaves a great deal of policy-making power to Council and gives them a degree of flexibility in meeting the needs of the municipality as they arise. A good charter, like a Constitution, does not attempt to cover all situations specifically; rather, charters are usually statements of fundamentals.
- ◆ As a member of the Charter Commission, you will need to make a commitment to complete the process of drafting a charter within several months of election as a Commissioner so that the proposed draft may be reviewed and presented to the residents of the community to be voted on within one year. The Charter Commission will be provided support information to assist in its deliberations and development of the charter.
