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# VILLAGE ACCEPTS NEW TRASH HAULING CONTRACT

The Village had three trash haulers bid our new three year hauling contract: Rumpke, Republic and Kimble. On February 16, Village Council accepted the lowest and best bid from Kimble Trash and Recycling and they will be our new trash hauler for the Village. The three year contract between Rumpke and the Village expires on March 31, 2022. **Effective April 1, 2022 the new hauler will be Kimble.**

Kimble will be sending out letters very soon to our residents explaining their services and what you will need to do to set up your specific service. Trash/recycling pick up will remain on Friday.

The new rate will be \$15.59 per month for weekly pick up and recycling. The cost also includes a 95 gallon trash cart and a 65 gallon recycling cart. This rate is fixed for 3 years.

Low volume bags will be \$3.50 per bag and will come in a pack of 10. These will have to be ordered directly from Kimble. If you still have remaining Rumpke bags, Kimble will allow them to be used until they are gone.

If you are a low volume bag user but still want to recycle, the cost is \$5.35/month in addition to the cost of the bags and it includes a recycling cart.

Rumpke will pick up any Rumpke owned trash carts in the Village on their last pick up day which will be March 25th. Kimble will outline in their letter (coming soon) when they will deliver their carts to the residents. The carts are included in the \$15.59 per month rate.

We have high hopes for a smooth transition from Rumpke to Kimble for our residents, so please be patient as any kinks are ironed out during the month of April.

## DOYLESTOWN COMMUNITY FOOD CUPBOARD

Since the beginning of 2020, there has been an increase in people seeking assistance from agencies on all different levels. The Doylestown Community Food Cupboard has been able to help families on the local level in spite of the increase of participants.



The Doylestown Community Food Cupboard is available to anyone living within Chippewa Township. **You are required to bring a valid photo ID and a current utility bill showing proof of residency.**

# DID YOU KNOW??...

**...How to tell if you live within the Village of Doylestown?**

Generally speaking, all addresses within the Village limits only have three numbers for their street address.

**...Who to call for information about a power outage?**

Ohio Edison is the electric company who services the area during outages. By going to their website, [www.firstenergycorp.com](http://www.firstenergycorp.com), you can report a power outage and find out information on outages in the area.

**...Who to call for street lights burned out?**

If you notice a street light burned out in the Village, please call the Police Department at 330-658-6582. Officer Tony Grimm coordinates getting the light bulbs replaced.

**...How to tell the difference between a county road and a township road?**

All Wayne County roads are marked with yellow center lines and white fog lines. All township roads within the county are not marked.

### BRUSH PICK-UP RESUMES

Brush pick up is held on the 2nd Monday of each month from now until October. Pick up dates will be: **March 14, April 11, May 9, June 13, July 11, August 8, September 12, and October 10**. Please note that weather may cause a delay on any of these regularly scheduled dates. Depending on the amount of brush residents have out, it may take more than one day to collect. **Please follow these rules:**

Each residence is allocated a maximum of 15 minutes worth of brush or leaves for disposal. Brush also needs to be stacked with branch ends all one direction. Cut ends need to be together and facing the street. This will help the Street Department as they load the branches into the chipper.

## VILLAGE INCOME TAXES NOW BEING PROCESSED BY RITA EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2022

As of January 1, 2022, all Village tax payments and tax forms for current and prior tax years are to be filed with RITA. We encourage you to utilize RITA'S electronic filing and payment system as it is fast, secure and simple to use. All residents and businesses now have complete access to RITA'S Fast File and myAccount applications.

Residents will no longer be able to come into Village Hall to file their returns. After January 1, 2022, any paperwork, payments, or other types of correspondence must be sent directly to RITA whether online or by mail. All checks must now be made out to "RITA". Residents have access to RITA 24/7 for questions on filing or other tax-related concerns. Documents can be sent to RITA at P. O. Box 477900 Broadview Heights, OH 44147-7900. ## Snow Plow Permits

**ORDINANCE 2009-28**  
**\$10 Annual Fee**



ALL PRIVATE SNOW REMOVAL FIRMS AND INDIVIDUALS SHALL REGISTER ANNUALLY WITH THE VILLAGE OF DOYLESTOWN IN ACCORD WITH THE PROVISIONS SECTION 5, HEREIN, PRIOR TO REMOVING, PUSHING OR PLOWING SNOW FROM ANY PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE VILLAGE. SUCH REGISTRATION WILL EXPIRE ANNUALLY ON JUNE 1 OF EACH YEAR.

## FROM THE ZONING DEPARTMENT

Jon Renninger is The Village of Doylestown Zoning Inspector. His office hours are Monday 4:00—6:00 pm and Tuesday through Friday 2:00-3:15 pm.



Please remember that pursuant to the Village's Codified Ordinance 1145.02 that:

(a) *No building or structure shall be built, altered, or repaired, no excavation Made, no use established, no change of use of a building or land permitted, except pursuant to the issuance of a Zoning Permit. No Zoning Permit shall be issued by the Zoning Inspector except in conformity with the provisions of this Zoning Ordinance.*

(b) *Applications for Zoning Permits shall be made to the Zoning Inspector on forms provided. Each application shall be accompanied by a plot plan drawn to scale showing the location, size and shape of the parcel of land, the location and uses of structures with respect to the property lines and to the right-of-way, the intended use, height and dimensions of proposed structures, driveways and access, off-street parking provisions, and any other information the Zoning Inspector deems necessary for consideration of the application, and a fee as established by Village Council.*

The Zoning Department would also like to remind Village residents of their responsibility to maintain their lawns, pursuant to Codified ordinance 1333.01:

*The owner of any lot or land must cut their grass and offensive and noxious weeds routinely. Any grass or weeds that are higher than EIGHT INCHES are in violation. This ordinance is in effect between May 1 and October 1.*

### WATER DEPARTMENT 2021 STATISTICS

#### WATER TREATMENT:

- \* 92,500,000 gallons of water were produced/treated
- \* 26 water lines were repaired which totaled \$39,100 in repair costs, four of which happened on Collier Drive.
- \* 2500 feet of water line along Collier Drive to Portage Street was replaced in late 2021/early 2022

#### WASTEWATER TREATMENT (SEWER):

- \* 91,800,000 gallons treated

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## **DOYLESTOWN CHARTER INFORMATION UPDATE**

The Village Charter Commission has been meeting and working diligently over the last several months. The Commission's goal was to create a charter allowing the Village to operate more efficiently and free the Village of the current outdated state directed formats as many of our neighboring communities have done. The goal was to make the fewest possible changes while streamlining our governmental processes to serve citizens' needs and provide the ability for the Village to adapt more easily, if necessary, in the future.

Co-Chairpersons Marie Lepley & Kim Dannemiller attended the February 16<sup>th</sup> Council meeting and presented the drafted charter to Council. Mayor Lindeman and members of Council accepted the drafted charter and forwarded it to Spiros Vasilatos, the Village Solicitor, to be reviewed. Once reviewed, it will be sent to the Wayne County Board of Elections to be placed on the November ballot.

The Charter Commission is now putting together documentation outlining the changes and benefits this new charter will provide. Concise summary information will be ready for publication in the near future. Public education sessions will be scheduled to share a summary and answer questions. All voters registered at the last general election will be mailed a copy of the charter for review prior to Election Day.

Town Hall meetings will be held to discuss and answer questions along with members of the Commission attending events in the community. Please visit the Village website, marquee and community page on cable TV for dates, times, and locations.
