DOYLESTOWN UTILITIES DEPARTMENT INTRODUCES NEW ONLINE PAYMENT SYSTEM

The Village's Utilities Department has launched a new and improved online bill pay service with more options. With InvoiceCloud, our customers can easily manage their accounts from home by signing up for AutoPay, e-bills, viewing your balance online, and making payments. InvoiceCloud offers more ways to make both receiving and paying utility bills easier and more efficient.

Here are some of the highlights InvoiceCloud offers:

- ◆ **Don't risk a delay receiving your bill by mail. Go paperless and receive your bill by email or text message**
- ◆ **InvoiceCloud will now act as an electronic connection between the Utilities Department and most banks when customers use their banks BillPay option**
- ◆ **Less paperwork and easier online payment process — make a payment by phone or text using a credit/debit card or e-check, or mobile payment option like Apple Pay or Google Pay. PayPal and Venmo are also acceptable forms of payment.**
- ◆ **Set it and forget it — schedule a payment to be deducted from your account on a future date**
- ◆ **Save time and avoid late payments with AutoPay. ****AutoPay customers will be charged a \$.25 fee by InvoiceCloud for this service, which is withdrawn in a separate transaction from your bank account.****
- ◆ **Call 1-844-713-0648 to make a secure payment from your phone**
- ◆ **Credit card payments can now accepted in our office as well**

VILLAGE OF DOYLESTOWN CHARTER UPDATE

The Charter Commission’s mission is to create a charter allowing the Village to operate more efficiently without the current outdated state-directed formats as many of our neighboring communities have done. The Commission’s goal is to eliminate or change some inefficiencies and retain the practices that are working well. This provides the ability for the Village to adapt more easily in the future.

The charter as written is known as “Mayor-Council-Administrator” and will provide for the hiring of a Village Administrator. Hiring a Village Administrator will provide a qualified person to focus on the demands of running the Village on a daily basis. The Village Council will be responsible for selecting, hiring and supervising the Administrator.

The Mayor and Council will continue to be positions elected by the citizens of the Village. This will relieve our current and future mayors of the responsibility of the day-to-day management of the Village and will allow the Mayor more time to be engaged with the citizens. This also allows for a wider variety of citizens to consider the position as currently the position of Mayor can be nearly a full-time job, which might deter some of our citizens from considering this opportunity.

The Mayor will continue as a vital part of governing the Village. The Mayor will still set agendas, preside over council meetings and be responsible for other key duties of the office, such as breaking tie votes of Village Council.

The new charter will eliminate the Board of Public Affairs by integrating those responsibilities into the daily duties of the Administrator. This will put the major responsibilities and supervision of budgets into one central location, making these efforts more efficient.

Another key change is to combine the Planning and Zoning Commissions into one group. This new Planning Commission should streamline our processes that previously took months down to days. This will be very helpful to our citizens trying to make improvements to their properties.

We encourage everyone to read the proposed charter and contact any of the Commission members, our Mayor or Village Council members with any questions. **The Charter is located at www.doylestown.com under “News Flash”.** We believe accepting the charter as written will allow our Village to operate more efficiently and provide the opportunity to adapt to future needs.

Public meetings will be held Thursday, 9/22/22, & Tuesday, 10/25/22, at 7:00 pm at the GDCC, 470 Park Dr.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FROM THE STREET DEPARTMENT

Mosquito spraying will occur upon request by residents. Please call 330-658-2181, ext. 1160 to leave your name and address.

Brush pick-up will continue on the following dates: **August 8, September 12, and October 10.** Place all branch ends so they face the street. Stumps and branches or bushes with briars and/or root balls are **not accepted**.

Please show respect to fellow residents using the sidewalks by keeping the area clear of grass, weeds and tree branches. Do not blow grass and other debris from mowing into the street. This can clog the street or storm water drains as well as cause problems for pedal bikes and motorcycles. The EPA can and will fine a community if they find debris in the roadway. Clippings can be bagged and placed in your regular trash for pick-up.

VILLAGE WIDE MULTIPLE LARGE ITEM FOR FALL IS OCTOBER 14

All upholstered items and mattresses must always be wrapped in plastic. NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OR TIRES. FREON MUST BE REMOVED from any appliance and **RED TAGGED** by a licensed technician. Paint cans are accepted but the paint has to be dried completely. Kitty litter can also be used to absorb the liquid inside each can. Please leave the lids off so Kimble can see that they are acceptable for pickup. Smaller TV's (sized 32" or smaller) accepted, and weigh less than 80 lbs. ELECTRIC AND GAS AGGREGATION UPDATES

Our previous **ELECTRIC AGGREGATION** with Energy Harbor has expired. Because of the volatility of the market, it has taken a few months to get a rate locked in; however, this rate with Energy Harbor ***will not be in place until the May 2023 meter read dates through May 2026 meter read dates***. Unfortunately, this means you will be responsible for finding the best rates for your household in the interim. There will be no fee to leave the program once signed up if you find a better rate at that time. The new rate will be 7.25¢ per kWh. You will receive a mailing with the information after the first of next year.

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) provides an “apples to apples” comparison of local utility companies and their rates. They can be found at <https://puco.ohio.gov/>.

Our contract for the **GAS AGGREGATION** with Interstate Gas Supply will expire October 31, 2022. Our third party company who negotiates the contracts for us will begin working on a new contract in August, at which time the new rates will be announced.

Again, because of the current volatile market, it is expected for gas rates to be higher whether we are in an aggregation or not. More information for a possible new gas aggregation contract will be provided as we get them.



UPCOMING CHANGES TO FALL LEAF PICK-UP SCHEDULE

The rising fuel costs have forced the Village to re-examine some past practices in order to utilize the taxpayers' money more efficiently.

Beginning this fall in mid to late October, the Village will be picking up leaves by neighborhood. Residences in each neighborhood will have three opportunities to have their leaves on the curb and ready for pick-up.

The Village will provide more detailed information regarding this new schedule when it is finalized. Look for more information to be in our next newsletter, on our website, and the TV channel.
