

# The Recycling Zone

At Village Hall, one of the most frequently asked questions we receive is about available recycling opportunities in Doylestown. We have compiled some information that we feel answers that very question.

The Village of Doylestown participates in a curbside recycling program with our trash hauler, Kimble Recycling & Disposal, Inc. This service takes place weekly on each Friday of the month. The items accepted with this service include: **Plastic, Metal and Bi-Metal, Aluminum and Glass**. These items can be co-mingled and placed directly in the recycling cart. Kimble provides the recycling cart as part of their “Regular Service” program. At this time, we are asking our residents to no longer use the small blue Village bins, as Kimble’s carts can be dumped automatically and more efficiently. When our residents recycle via the curbside program, the Village receives funds based on the tonnage collected quarterly by Kimble. This program is a grant funded by the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District called Recycling Makes Sense. Money received from this grant funds various programs in the Village, and our document shredding held every September or October is one example.

The Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District ALSO HAS PLACED A RECYCLING CENTER ON Galehouse Road in Chippewa Township down the road from the township garage (14228 Galehouse Rd.) on the left-hand side before the railroad tracks. There are four (4) cardboard bins, one (1) paper bin, and also bins for plastic bottles and jugs, metal, and glass. This facility is open 24/7.

Cell phones and used ink jet cartridges are accepted at the Methodist Church, and Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic School.
